How Long Does RCIA Take?

RCIA takes the distinctive history and spiritual needs of *each* person into account—whether baptized or unbaptized; active in another Christian tradition or little experience with Christian living; significant exposure to Roman Catholic worship and beliefs, or none. RCIA is not so much a program as it is the Church's way, worldwide, of ministering sensitively to those who are drawn to Catholicism. Some people will need more time than others to prepare for the lifetime commitment that comes with the Catholic faith. Having said that, preparation most often takes nine months or more for the unbaptized and/or uninitiated; it can be less for mature Christians already baptized and seeking full communion. However, the process of spiritual renewal and faith formation should not be hasty, especially for those not accustomed to the fasts and feasts, Sundays and seasons that Catholics observe. **Immaculate Conception RCIA classes will begin on September 12.** Are you a non-Catholic who has been worshipping at a Catholic Church? Have you considered joining the Catholic Church? Do you want to know more about the Catholic faith? RCIA is for anyone Baptized or unbaptized who have never received the sacraments of Eucharist or Confirmation. The program is also open to all Catholics who want to learn more about their faith. It's a system that uses a woman's signs of fertility to determine the fertile and infertile times of her cycle. Approved by the Catholic Church, NFP enables couples to avoid pregnancy by practicing chaste abstinence during the fertile time of the woman's cycle. As a married couple, why should you consider NFP in your marriage as opposed to artificial contraception? **Come to a very special presentation at Immaculate Heart of Mary Church on August 19th from 6:30 to 8 p.m. in the parish social hall.** Dr. Luis Garcia, MD of York will present on basic Church teaching regarding sexuality and NFP, and then will teach on various forms of NFP and the science behind them.
