

Year of Mercy Scripture for Meditation from Pope Francis: Lk 15:1-32.

A man fell victim to robbers who stripped and beat him and went off leaving him half-dead.

The Samaritan, a social outcast among the Jews, went out of his way to care for the victim's needs. Who are the victims on our streets waiting for our acts of mercy? Seek out those in need of food, clothing and shelter and attend to their needs. Consider leading or participating in a clothing drive for the poor. Sort through your own clothes and household items and donate cleaned and gently used items. Donate new diapers for babies and donate food to the local food pantry. In addition, explore, with your family, what it means to dress modestly in all places. Help our children to become more aware of the consequences of over-exposure of body parts. Instill the gracefulness of seeing every person as a temple of the goodness of God.
